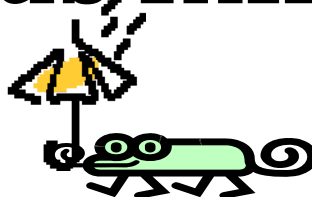

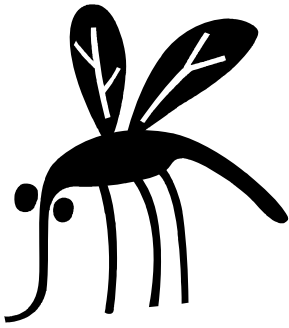
I'm sitting in my office staring at two framed baptismal certificates of long-passed great-grandparents. Neither certificate is in English. Both are in Pennsylvania Dutch. The one, a maternal great-grandmother, died about the time of my birth. The other, her husband and my great-grandfather, lived long enough for me to have memories of him with his strong accent, wooden leg, and dementia.

Though both great-grandparents were born shortly after the Civil War, I sometimes wonder, besides genetic material, what have they passed along to me? Is there anything that possibly has passed along to my son and my grandson? I don't know. I do know that at times when I speak, I hear one of my parents speaking. When I hear Mary Beth speak, I occasionally hear her parents speak. From where....from whom, perhaps....did our parents' speech come? Are more than cells, genes, hair and eye color, stature, etc. passed on? I remember seeing a picture of Martin Luther's descendants in an issue of *National Geographic* magazine on the year of Luther's 500th birthday (1983). I was amazed at how many, after all these generations, looked like Luther!

In this season of Easter I think about new life. Yet I am reminded that so much of what we call new is yet built upon something old. God continues to create new. And it would seem that much of God's creation comes forth from that which has been. So what is it that we do? What is it that we are building? What is it that we are leaving behind? We worry about that sometimes. It is good that we do. Yet be assured God can take what we leave and work with it to create something and even someone new.

Now I have to go out and tie the dog loose and outen the light. And I'll do that right after I throw Mary Beth down the stairs her shoes.I wonder where I got that kind of speech?

World Malaria Day—April 25, 2013!



This day has turned into a special week focusing on the work of the ELCA Malaria Campaign. In recognition of this, our congregation has collected \$585.00 for the purchase of mosquito nets. The Lenten Offering will also go to the ELCA Malaria Campaign.

DID YOU KNOW: Since 2009, cases of malaria in Zimbabwe have been cut in half, from 737,000 deaths to just over 300,000 in 2011. Community leaders are trained in malaria prevention and control—educating others through home visits, song, dance and drama.

An estimated 26,000 people will directly benefit from Lutheran malaria programming. Our gifts will continue to make a difference.

Offering of Letters

Again this year, University Lutheran will participate in the Offering of Letters on May 5, coordinated by Bread for the World, a Christian advocacy organization urging our nation's decision makers to end hunger. The theme this year is, "A Place at the Table", also the title of a documentary which just opened nationwide focusing on our calling to set a table for our brothers and sisters who hunger and thirst.

Citizens across the nation will focus their letters on petitioning President Obama to set a goal and work with Congress on a plan to end hunger in the US and abroad. We will write letters to our congressional delegation asking them to protect programs that are vital to hungry and poor people, and to work with the President on a plan to end hunger.

David Gist, regional representative of Bread, was at the Campus Center on Saturday, March 16 to meet with persons from around the Valley interested in the Offering.

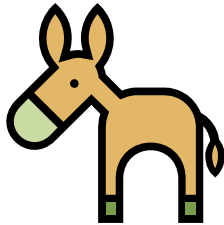

"Viva Peru"

Congratulations to Christine Wilkins who was accepted into the "Viva Peru" program to spend a month this summer in Peru working in public health. Christine, a Spanish major, hopes to be a doctor and work with those rarely receiving quality medical care. She asked council if she could make a request to the congregation for support and council approved. Her goal is to raise \$1,700 and any assistance would be appreciated. Christine served as our Student Intern. Below is her e-mail to the church council:

"My trip this summer will be from June 23-July 25 and I will be located in Trujillo, Peru. The program cost (not including airfare and insurance) is \$1700, which includes a donation to the clinic where I will be volunteering. I will be working in a medical clinic or hospital during weekdays where I will be interacting in Spanish with the patients and observing procedures (much like what Katy Lichtsinn and I did in Chile, except it would be the sole focus of this trip). I wanted to know if I could do some modest fundraising at ULC to offset some of the program cost. Vive Peru is a nonprofit 501(c)(3) organization based in Mesa, Arizona, and any donations for the purpose of this trip can be written off as a charitable contribution. One way to do this is to make a check out to VIVEPERU with my name in the memo line. They have programs in three cities in Peru and their programs are clinical medicine, teaching English, teaching music, engineering, and social work.

Summer Connections

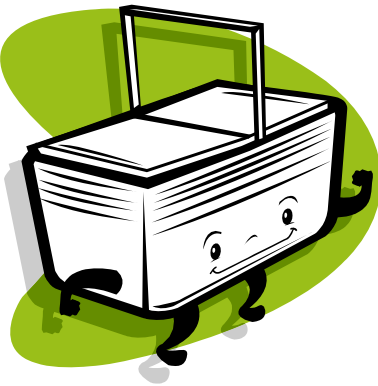

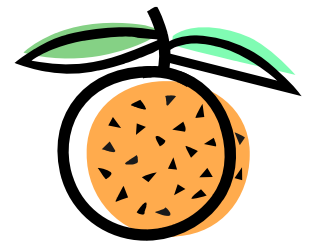

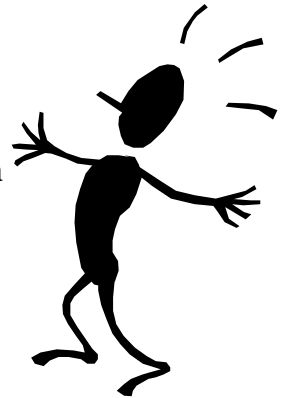
