


## PASTOR'S NOTES

In April we did a very ordinary and typical thing on two consecutive Wednesdays. We worshiped, heard the words of a sermon, and gathered around Christ's table to receive Christ's body and blood. Of course, in many ways this is *never* something ordinary. The Good News of Christ, the reception of the sacrament is always *extraordinary*. In many ways it continues to be one of the most counter-cultural activities in which the church engages. And we do it twice weekly here at ULC/LCM.

These two weeks in April were different. The first Wednesday we assembled, not at our location, but at First Methodist with Valley Wesley Campus Ministry. The second Wednesday the Methodists traveled here to be with us. On the surface, no big deal. Methodists and Lutherans have always been friendly with one another. Digging a bit more deeply, we just might see more than mere friendship involved.

First, we (ELCA) share an official recognition of ministry with the United Methodist Church. Our gathering together around Christ's table is precisely that....a recognition that above all this *is* Christ's table. It is Christ who is the host. And our unity is found in Christ and all that he has done and all that he is.

Second, this recognition of unity becomes even more important with the changing culture of Christianity in our nation, our world, and right here at home, in Tempe and the ASU community. Currently I would say the United Methodists, the Episcopalians, and we ELCA Lutherans remain as the only main-line Christian ministry at ASU. We are also one of the few ministries denominationally related. Most now are para-church groups with a different system of accountability.

On a campus well in excess of 50,000 students, what are we against so many? We are a different voice than that heard most often. We provide a different welcome and refuge. We provide a different challenge and definition of following. Togetherness and partnership in this ministry is more than welcome.....it is *necessary*. The one who fed over 5,000 with a few loaves and fishes is able to do great things with so few. Remember, it was Jesus who provided the food, but the followers who did the feeding. ....

Gather 'round the table this summer. Jesus continues to feed.
