January 2, 2025: "The Last Ride of the Pony Express: My 2,000-mile Horseback Journey into the Old West" by Will Grant (2023) (Jean)

Cowboy/journalist Will Grant embarks on an authentic, present-day horseback journey, following the trail of the short-lived frontier mail service known as the Pony Express. During the 1860s, letter mail was carried on horseback between Missouri and San Francisco on a high-speed 10-day schedule. The trail ran through a dry, lonesome and mostly uninhabited wilderness. Author Will Grant does not restrict his research to libraries, but actually rides the entire route himself with his two horses, Chicken Fry and Badger. Along the way, he creates a picture of the American West informed by the farmers, ranchers, historians and businessmen who live along the trail. [This work was selected as one of the Best Travel Books of the Year by the Smithsonian.]
